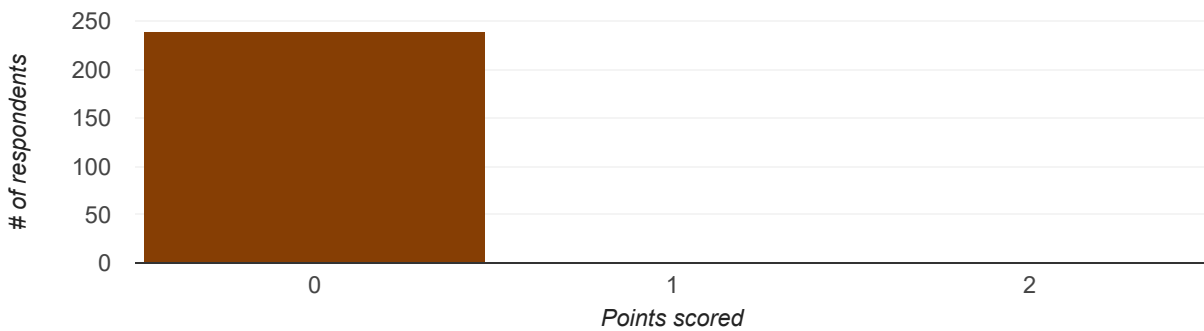

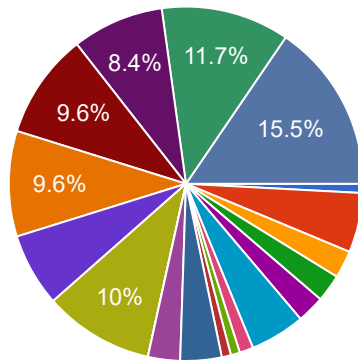

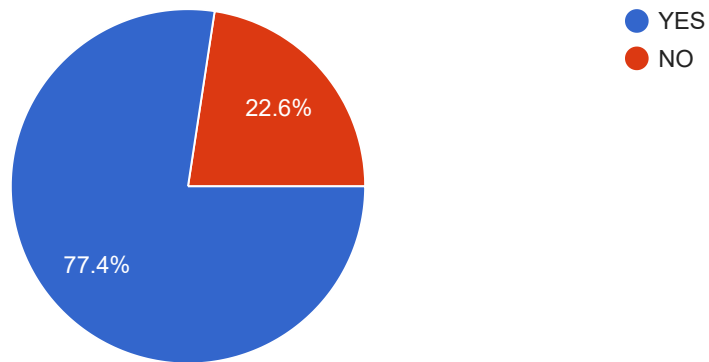

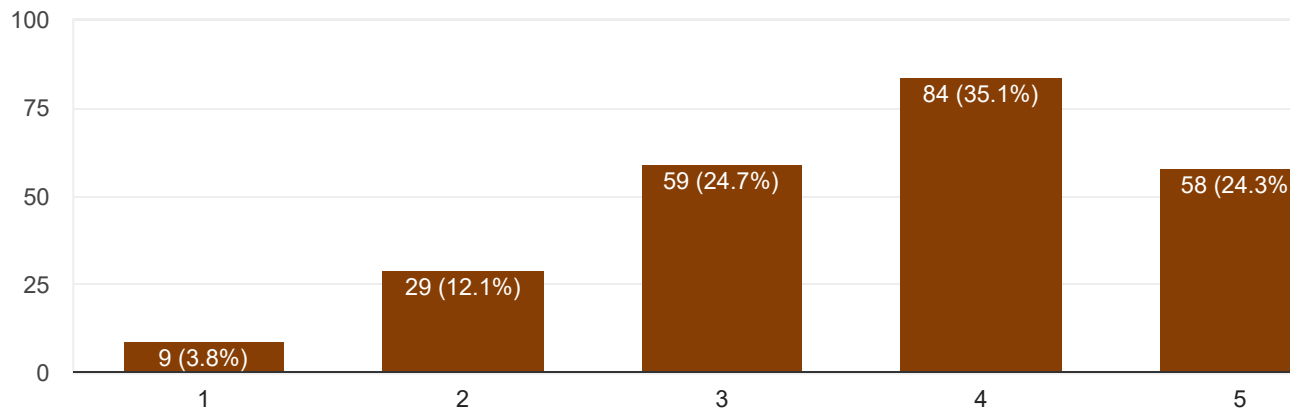

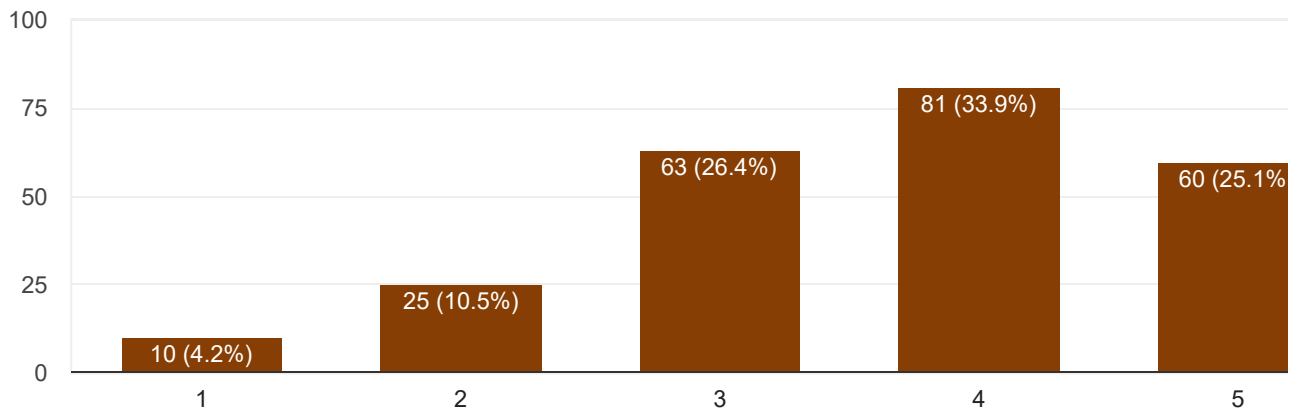

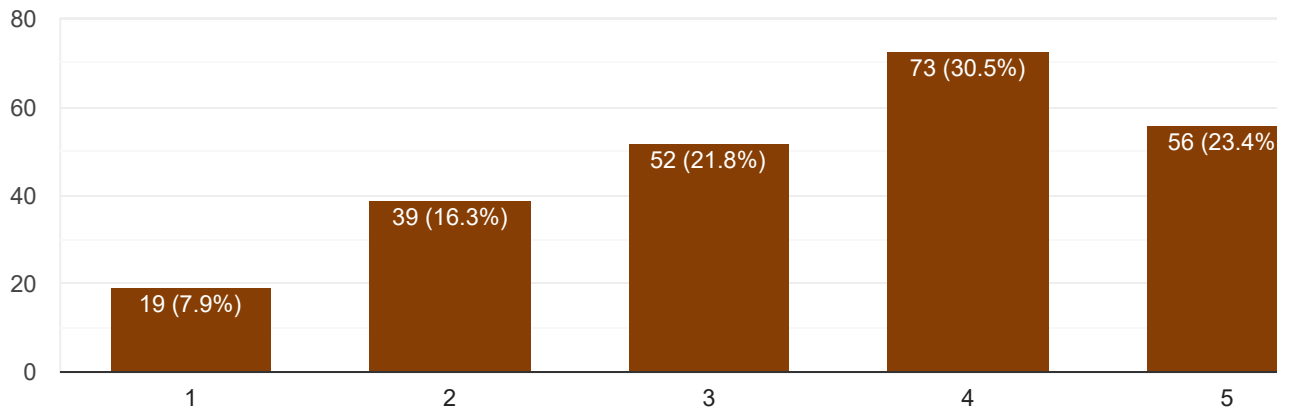
Quality of the Teaching-Learning Experience

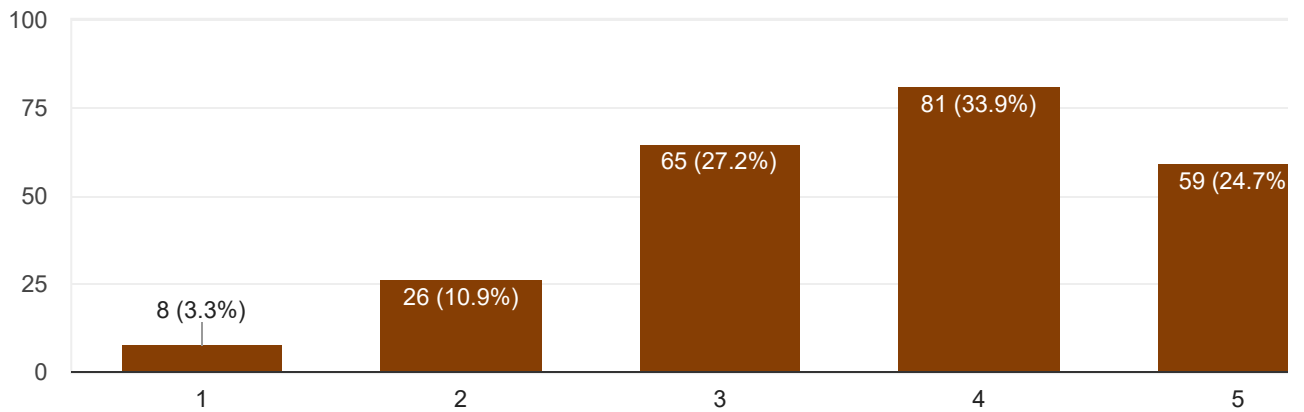
Generation of interest in the subject

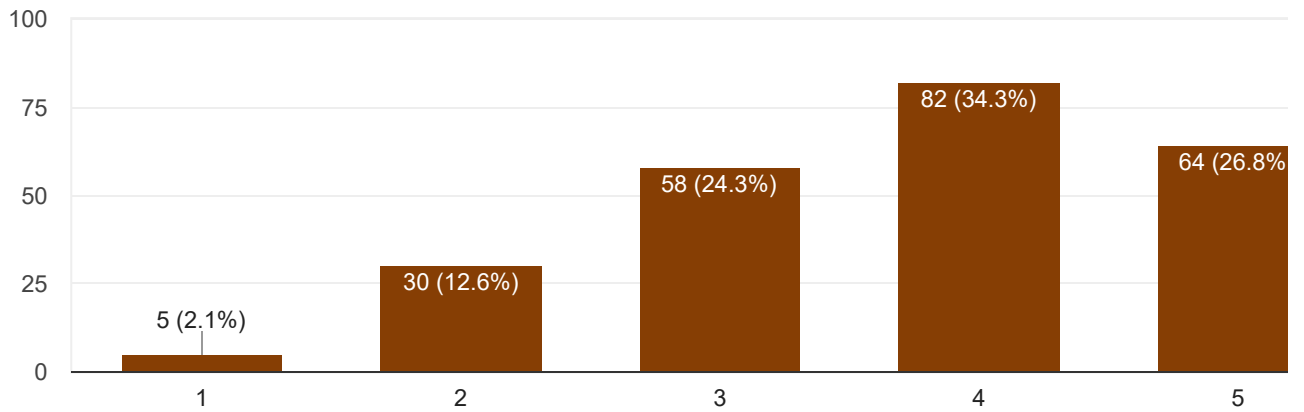
Effectiveness of the evaluation formats in CIA

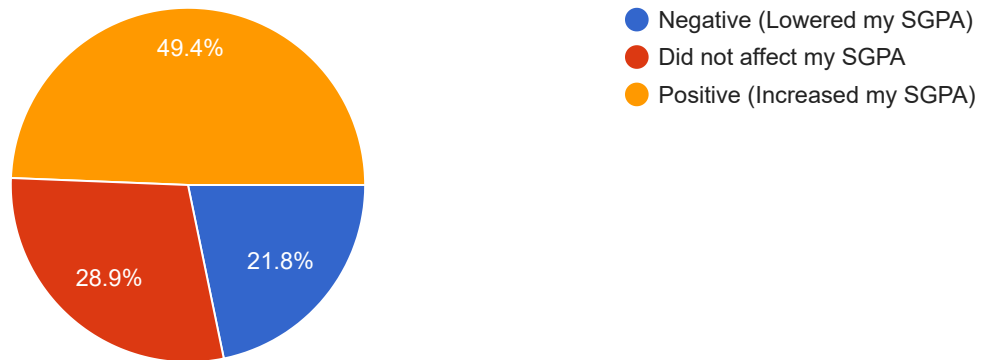
Effectiveness of the End Semester evaluation

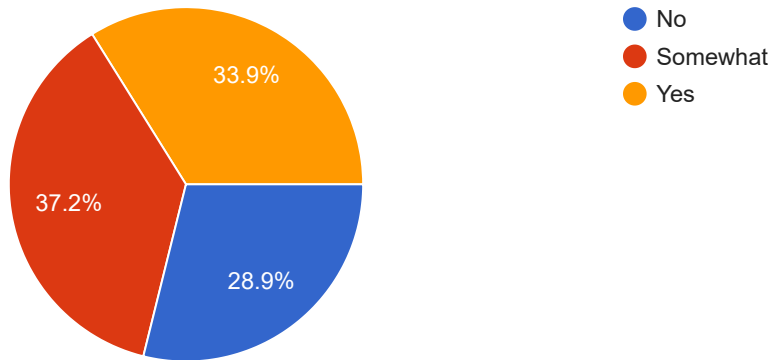
Impact of the marks obtained in CFC on your overall SGPA

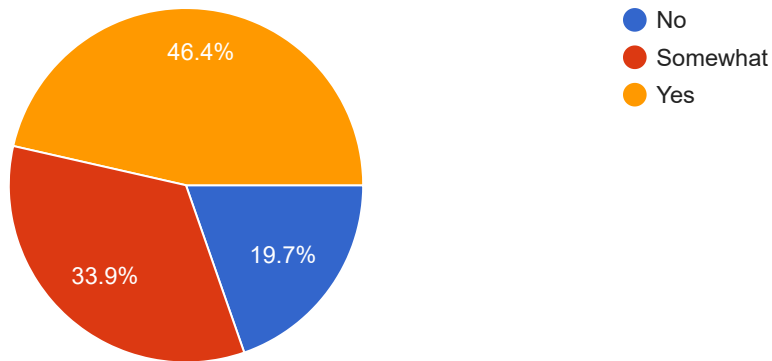
Has the CFC contributed to your personal development in any way?

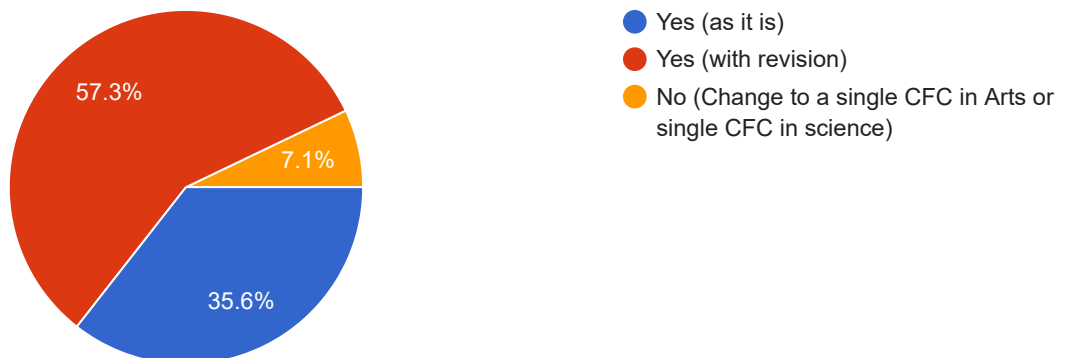
Has the CFC contributed to your intellectual development in any way?

Should the current structure of diverse CFC linked to specific departments be retained

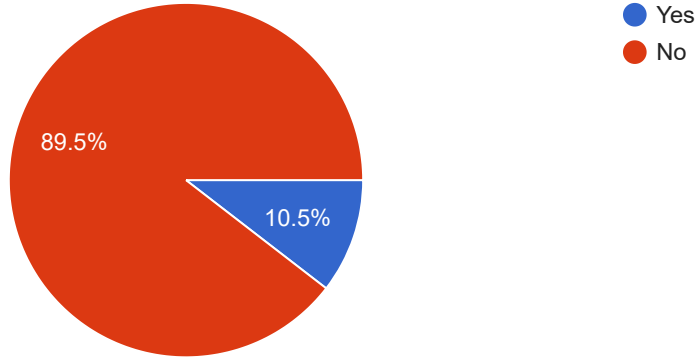

Restructuring CFC

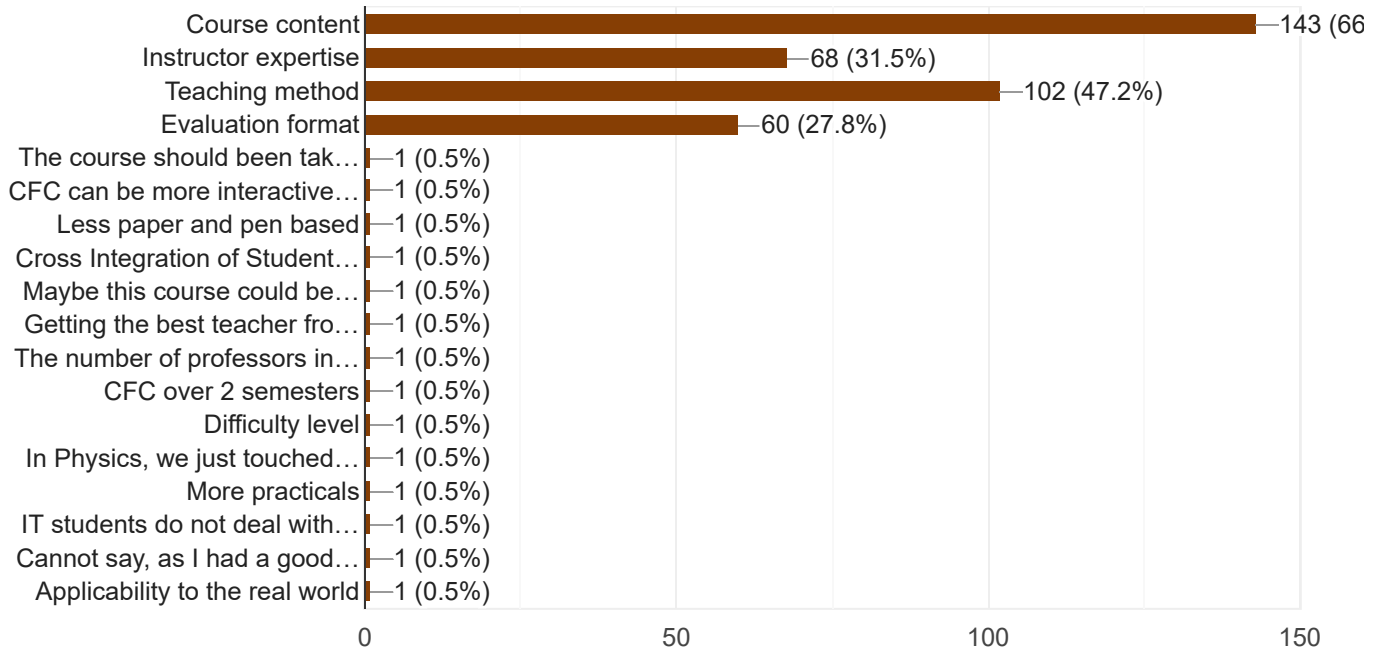
Would a single common CFC in Science for all Arts students, and a single common CFC in Arts for all Science students, be better according to you?
