One winning team from each state will represent their college at National Youth Summit to be organized in New Delhi in June. Through innovative ideas and enthusiastic participation, the youth can create a movement to create positive change for the environment.

THE ACTIVITY

WWF-India in partnership with the registered college will launch Echo for engagement of students enrolled in the college, through a year-long membership for the students. Each college will nominate one teacher convenor and four youth representatives to lead and represent the respective college in Echo. The nominated youth representatives will work towards engaging other youth in the college to work towards the conservation action project under the theme and help resolve an environmental issue in their college, community or city. WWF-India will provide mentorship, support and guidance for the implementation of the project.

At the beginning of the academic year, one day workshop for the nominated youth representatives and teacher convenor will be organized for all participating colleges. The workshop will include an in depth education on the theme of the year through movie screenings, expert talks and various interactive activities. It will include assisted brainstorming session with the youth representatives on project development, including areas and communities to be targeted, operational requirements, involvement of all students etc. Once the projects are finalized and approved by WWF-India, WWF-India will

provide mentorship and will review progress of the projects through review meetings. At the end of the academic year, state and national level summits will be organized, where the best projects will be recognized through a trophy, certificates, and goodies.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBLITES

Participating college/Institution:

1. College will be responsible to nominate four youth representatives. This is a pre-requisite for activation of college membership.

2. College shall nominate a teacher convener as a point of contact to coordinate Echo activities within a college and with WWF-India.

3. College shall be responsible for sending nominated youth and teacher convenor to attend the one day workshop at the designated venue.

4. College shall be responsible for ensuring administrative permissions and smooth running of the program.

5. The college shall ensure participation of nominated youth and teacher convenor in the State Summit and National Summit

WWF-India:

- Conduct echo forum for nominated youth
- 2. Provide mentoring support during the course of project implementation
- 3. Provide volunteering opportunities to registered students in various WWF-India projects
- 4. Provide membership cards to nominated youth and other students who avail Type B membership
- 5. Collect and collate bi-monthly reports of the project implemented by college
- 6. Provide opportunity to participate in WWF-India courses, workshops, excursions, movie screening and nature trails at subsidized cost (for students registered under Type B membership).

Report on ECHO Project

(2019-20)

ECHO - Environment Conservation Hero of the Year

This is a program by WWF-India, where enrolled colleges have to design, develop and implement a project related to the environment conservation theme. The entire activity is spread over the entire academic year. At the end of the academic year, the projects are reviewed and evaluated on the set parameters at the state elimination round and the selected college from the state gets a chance to participate in the national level summit. The college selected at the national level summit showing a maximum impact of their project are declared as "Environment Conservation Hero of the Year".

The Department of Zoology, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) Mumbai, enrolled in this project in the academic year 2019-20.

The project revolved around the key theme of reducing, reusing and recycling. This project began with the idea of eliminating plastic from the college campus.
