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



Peace of mind, gratification and satisfaction v/s luxury and financial stability:

The field of wildlife biology and/or conservation is rewarding in the experiences it allows you to have, exposing you to a wide range of habitats and environments that a lay person or tourist would seldom get the chance to visit. It keeps your mind sharp and you physically fit (provided you are someone who enjoys and pursues field work). But very few are lucky enough to have the luxury of disposable income. This being said, there is more money to be earned in this field today than there was even three years ago. NGOs are getting better at writing proposals for grants, contract-based positions for research assistants/affiliates are available and a handful of well-paying jobs like those of naturalists, guides or consultants are also attainable. If you're academically inclined, there are no limits to the number of organisations you could form affiliations with or independent research projects that you could pursue – and you're likely to receive stipends/scholarships/grants for the same.

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

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


