



**Report:** A gender sensitization workshop for faculty members of the college was organized in SCAVI on January 31st, 2020, at 2pm which was attended by 41 teaching staff. The CEO of Red Dot foundation conducted a two- hour session discussing and addressing key differences regarding sex and gender that the modern teaching fraternity should be aware of. A few concerns were raised regarding the various problems that both staff and students may encounter in their daily lives and Ms. Elsa gave some practical solutions to those problems and discussed the POSH and POSCO Acts which are extremely relevant to the context and thus important for stakeholders to be aware of its usage. She also identified social stereotyping as an important cause of the problems relating to sex and gender roles that individuals are expected to abide by rather than being allowed to make an informed choice based on their preferences.





Report: First Quadrangle (Assembly after drill and demonstration of the use of extinguisher The lab safety committee of the college recognizing the need for fire safety organized a fire safety training and drill through Rarico Fire Services. The event was attended by 107 participants (68 non-teaching, 18 teaching and 21 students) from the college including the principal Dr. Rajendra Shinde. Dr. Priya Sundarrajan (Convener, Lab safety committee), introduced the topic and the company, Rarico fire services. The first session was conducted in the MMR, during which, the Rarico team headed by Mr. K. J. George trained the teaching and non-teaching faculty of the college regarding various aspect of fire safety. The aspects covered in the training were:

- 1. Types of fire: 5 types of fire A (Solid material- paper, wood etc.), B (Liquid fires involving kerosene, petrol), C (Fires involving gases), D (Electric fire) and K (Kitchen fires) were elucidated.
- 2. Stages of fire: Initiation, critical and blaze stages for the above-mentioned fire types were covered.
- 3. Types and use of extinguishers: The use of ABC extinguishers used in our college was explained to the audience in detail by an experienced member of Rarico team. He also mentioned the CO<sub>2</sub> type of extinguisher and the foam type of extinguisher.
- 4. DOs and DON'Ts in the event of a fire: Common instructions like not using the elevator or terrace, the meaning of the acronym FIRE (Find out Inform Risk use area/Request Exit/Extinguisher), emergency protocols for kitchen vs electric fire were some of the areas touched upon by the trainers. Audience also asked many questions.

The second part of the event involved a mock drill where all attendees were asked to report to the first quadrangle within 3 min just as they would be in a fire drill. In the first quadrangle, the Rarico team demonstrated the use of the ABC type of extinguisher on a small fire set in a metal tray. Many staff members and students were asked to volunteer to try out the use of the extinguisher as well. Both sessions were particularly useful for the faculty and students. The sessions also witnessed a lively interaction between the trainers and the audience. The feedback for the sessions were taken in the form of an online questionnaire.



#### Report for 'online skill development workshop on transition to online learning

On declaration of lockdown in the mid of March 2020 due to the SARS COV 2 Pandemic there was an immediate need for the college faculty to connect with their students, especially the TY and master's Part 2 students, to aid their preparation for the final end semester exams as well as other students to keep them academically focussed.

Father Roy Pereira of Creighton University, Omaha, USA, and Mr. Marazban Kotwal, the Head of the Chemistry Department of St. Xavier's College collaborated to organise a workshop in conferencing platforms especially focussed on ZOOM Platform which was gaining popularity in USA and picking up a feeble momentum in India.

Father Roy Pereira and Mr. Marazban Kotwal trained the faculty in using the ZOOM platform to share screen, share videos, share audio clips and use the virtual whiteboard effectively for teaching. 

# Workshop on 'Mind Maps - A Creative Tool for Teaching, Learning and Beyond'

Date: 6th & 7th May 2020

**Report:** The workshop on Mind mas a creative tool for teaching, learning and beyond was organised by Department of Life Science and Biochemistry in collaboration with Internal quality assurance cell of the college. The workshop was condcuted on 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> may 2020. The workshop was attended by more than 60 senior college staff memebrs who participated actively in the interaction session during the workshop. Dr. Radhika Tendulkar, Faculty member from the Department of Life Science and Bicoechemstry condcuted the session.

The Mind Map is a graphical tool used to represent an exceptionally large volume of information in a concise manner on a single sheet of paper. This tool makes use of varied cognitive skills executed by different regions of the human cerebrum. Cognitive skills pertaining to perception of colours, images, numbers, words and the associations between all of these are harnessed in a mind map, for better clarity, recall and organisation of vast amounts of data.

The workshop was aimed at introducing to the faculty this creative tool for classroom teaching. The workshop was divided in 2 sessions. The first session dealt with understanding the concept of a mind map, ways/norms to construct mind maps and the varied advantages of this graphical technique in personal and professional life. Faculty were guided in constructing mind maps on topics such as i) Myself today (Lockdown diaries) ii) My plan for the next academic year, iiii) Profile of a committee that you work for. Selected Mind maps were presented for a review, discussion and feedback in session two. This was followed by a presentation on different ways to use a mind map for classroom teaching, assessment, planning of events/tasks/meetings, decision making etc, based on personal experiences and case studies. This was followed by faculty interaction for sharing experiences pertaining to this tool.



academic year move in a smooth flow was also offered as a part of the training of this workshop.



CoVID-19 has pushed the education ecosystem into unchartered areas. Online Education and Learning posed many opportunities and at the same time posed many challenges. One such challenge is that of inclusion and accessibility for Students with Disabilities (SwDs). With the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act (2016), all higher education institutes have been mandated with a 5% reservation for students with disabilities and ensuring inclusive education. What worked for inclusion in physical classrooms may not work for online classrooms. Given XRCVC's expertise in the area it was felt necessary for the XRCVC to undertake research in this space and offer its learnings not only to the college faculty but also to other institutes as everyone began the online learning process.

The 2-day workshop aimed to:


- Acquaint participants to the challenges of Inclusion for Online Learning.
