

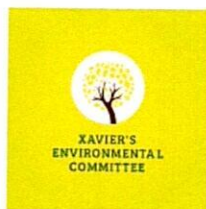

IMG JANFEST Waste Management Plan



Janfest Waste Management Plan Xaviers Environmental Committee

The Xavier's Environmental Committee is glad to be collaborating with the IMG to strive to make Janfest the first fest of St. Xavier's College that is a 'zero-waste'. As a committee, our vision is to make all fests of this college produce net-zero waste. We are glad that Janfest has agreed to review our plan and implement it. It is our sincere hope that our efforts to better the waste management system are realised so we can create guidelines for future fests.

The importance of waste management at a large scale, such as college fests, cannot be emphasised enough. The amount of waste generated, the kind, as well as the extent of segregation, finally determines whether we are helping or harming our environment.

The XEC proposes the following changes be made to the current waste management system:

The following is a list of all the probable waste items that will be generated during Janfest (as understood from the IMG exec body):

Wet waste	Leftover food	Organic waste - fruit peels, flowers		
Recyclable dry waste	Paper waste, cups and plate	Tickets & Brochures	Decor cardboard	Food Wrappers (MLPs) and tetra packs
Non-recyclable dry waste	Tape, threads, misc	Flex banners (shall ensure reuse inside and outside college)		

Along with miscellaneous items, that shall make up a very small share.

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The following occupancy areas have been considered as significant to the production of waste:

1. Quadrangle
2. Foyer
3. Hall
4. Artist management rooms
5. IMG Office

In view of the above information, we propose the following number of bins be placed in the respective locations:

QUADRANGLE (ATTENDEES AND WORKFORCE)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2 bins for tickets and brochures at exit• 2 bins for paper cups and plastics at tea stalls• 3 bins for paper cups, plastics and other waste in the quad• 3 bins for paper cups, plastics and other waste at the entrance.
FOYER (WORKFORCE)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 3 big bins for wet waste, dry waste and other waste. All leftover food, plates and cutlery should without fail be segregated into the respective bins.
ARTIST MANAGEMENT	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 3 bins for wet waste, paper cups and plates and other waste. Ensure that the workforce in the room disposes the waste properly.
WORKFORCE WASTE (DECOR)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 1 bin to collect all paper and cardboard waste,• 1 bin to dispose used tape, threads, glue etc.• All flex banners to be collected and given to the XEC separately for reuse.

The XEC plans to take full responsibility for disposing the waste generated by the attendees and the workforce as we have been assured that the waste generated by the vendors for logistical equipment will be taken care of by them. All trash bins will be labelled and provided by the XEC, as will be the storage for the waste. The waste generated by the attendees and workforce is to be sent for recycling to *Stree Mukti Sanghatana* and will be collected by them on 27th January, 2020.



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The waste in the bins shall be periodically emptied, if the bins are full, by the support staff of the college. Necessary coordination with the administration will be conducted by the XEC.

We will require cooperation by the IMG to ensure that the waste generated by the workforce is segregated as required, and to instruct the attendees as far as possible to segregate their waste as well. We shall be placing bins in convenient locations. We shall also require the IMG to ensure waste that is not collected at the source, i.e. posters, decor, etc., to be collected before the arrival of the Stree Mukti Sanghatana's collection, in accordance with the college rules. The exact timings shall be conveyed soon.

We hope this venture is feasible and successful as it will encourage students of the workforce and the attendees more aware and sensitised towards the issue of waste segregation. We aim to make people realise that segregating waste is an effort towards the general betterment of the environment and can make a huge difference when done correctly on such a large scale. Hence, it would be greatly appreciated if this endeavour is publicised during/after the event and more attention is brought to the sustainable and environmentally conscious nature of Janfest, the XEC and the campus.



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
