
International Conference on 'The Politics of Environment in Asia: People, Policies and Development'







Field Visit to Drought affected Latur, Marathwada following the discussion with MLC Vidhyatai Chavan, Vidhan Sabha, Maharashtra

Following the discussion with MLC Vidhyatai Chavan at the Vidhan Sabha, 14 students along with the guidance of Head- Department of Political Science, Dr. Pratiba Naitthani visited the villages of Latur, Marathwada on 12-13th September 2015.

They were exposed to the ground realities of absolute exploitation and severe conditions of the farmers. By visiting various districts we understood the acute problems of water scarcity and the drought Marathwada is facing. Besides water scarcity, lack of employment and failure of government schemes and initiatives was vividly clear. To take further action we have decided to help raise funds for the building of Percolation Tanks which could be a scientific and efficient solution to water depletion. We also attempt to initiate setup of small-scale businesses and industries, to generate employment and independence in the landless labourers.


