IQAC REPORT 2022-2023

St. Xavier's College is committed to providing a high-quality education that prepares students for the ever-changing demands of the world and is a great place for students who are interested in research and lifelong learning.

The theme of the College for 2022-23 is 'learn, unlearn and relearn' which is particularly relevant in today's rapidly evolving job market. Students must be able to adapt to new technologies, and skill sets and find creative solutions to challenges posed by the pandemic.

The IQAC meetings were held in a hybrid mode on the Zoom platform for the four meetings in the academic year held on 17th October 2022, 18th January 2023, 20th March 2023, and 27th April 2023. Important decisions such as passing the AQAR 2021-22, seed money policy and the NEP credit framework for implementation were the focus points of IQAC 2022-23.

The challenging task for the IQAC and the National Education Policy (NEP) Cell of the college was to prepare for the implementation of NEP in 2023-24 and stay ahead of the curve. The preparation began in the even semester with multiple deliberations by the NEP core committee, HODs, and all faculty. All faculty cooperated and the BOS of 25 departments was completed successfully in the stipulated time (1 & 1/2 months). Further, the Academic Council approved all courses offered by the departments of Arts, Commerce, and Science with the credit framework that was designed. Amendments were also made as per the 20th of April 2023 Government Resolution (GR) by the 31st of May 2023, showing the college's commitment to timely compliance and implementation.

Seed money:

- ✓ Seed money proposals were presented by 6 departments. The departments of Mathematics, Geology/AIC, Microbiology, Zoology & Life Science received the seed money amount of Rs. One lakh each. The progress of the research work will be reviewed after 6 months. The initiative taken by the Management for the disbursement of the seed money was well appreciated.

Teaching plans:

- ✓ Teaching plans were submitted by the Departments for both the odd and even semesters.

Feedback and Survey:

Online teaching questionnaire:

- ✓ An online teaching questionnaire was administered (odd and even semesters) for UG and PG students. As a follow-up, the analysis was shared with individual teachers to help them understand their strengths and weaknesses.
- ✓ Sit-ins for new teachers were done by the Vice Principals and Department HODs. The strong and weak points were discussed with the faculty individually.

Faculty feedback questionnaire:

- ✓ A questionnaire of 36+12= 48 questions was prepared and administered to the teachers regarding their work life.



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Honours Certificate Programme:

- ✓ A total of 696UG students across all disciplines registered for the Honours Certificate Programme. The Honours certificate will be awarded to 77 TY students who have successfully completed the co-curricular activity. In addition, individual credit cards for all Honours activities will be given to the students.

DBT Grants:

- ✓ Statistics used the DBT Star Status - recurring grant to conduct seminars and workshops.
- ✓ DBT-Builder for PG departments - recurring was used to purchase consumables which were used for the Builder projects.

National Education Policy Implementation:

- ✓ The NEP Core Committee meetings were held every Friday in the even semester to decide upon a suitable credit framework for the college, as per the guidelines received from the MU and Maharashtra steering committee. The NEP will be implemented from the academic year 2023-24.
- ✓ NEP was explained to parents during the Parent Teacher Meetings of junior as well as senior college.
- ✓ Based on the NEP credit framework designed for SXCM, BOS meetings were held in all departments of Arts, Commerce, and Science. The Academic Council approved all UG courses that were presented. The Steering Committee of Maharashtra issued a GR on 20th April 2023, so accordingly amendments were made.
